

Report of the CSTM Membership Secretary, 2002

Figures in this report are as of 2002 October 20. Members who have not paid up beyond the end of 2001 have now been deleted. See Table 1.

Since the last report (October 2001) there have been 11 new individual memberships added. With deletions, there has been a net change of minus 2. See Table 2. There were also 3 new institutional memberships added, for a net change of minus 4. See Table 3. The overall net change is minus 6.

This drop in membership is similar to last year, but note that the high number of members in the grace period (paid to the 1st quarter of 2002) indicates a further drop of 10-15 members in December. See Table 1 again. This has already had a negative effect on membership revenue for the year.

This report also contains a summary of members with their post-secondary affiliation. See Table 4.

The long term membership trend is shown in Table 5 and the associated graph. The decline is about 4% per annum compounded.

The figures in this report are approximately comparable to last year's figures.
