

Report of the CSTM Membership Secretary, 2004

Figures in this report are as of 2004 October 18. Most members who have not paid up beyond the end of 2003 have now been deleted. The 13 members were not deleted because they are expected to renew. See Table 1.

Since the last report (October 2003) there have been 23 new individual memberships added. With deletions, there has been a net change of plus 12. See Table 2. There were also 2 new institutional memberships added, for a net change of plus 3 (this figure is 3 rather than 2 since a former institutional member has re-subscribed). See Table 3. The overall net change is plus 15.

This is the second year in a row with an increase in membership. I hope that this reflects a permanent change from the previous overall downward trend, but it is too early to be certain.

This report also contains a summary of members with their post-secondary affiliation. See Table 4.

The long term membership trend is shown in Table 5 and the associated graph.

The figures in this report are approximately comparable to last year's figures.
