## Report of the CSTM Membership Secretary, 2005

Figures in this report are as of 2005 October 16. Members who have not paid up beyond the third quarter of 2004 have now been deleted. See Table 1.

Since the last report (October 2004) there have been 18 new individual memberships added. With deletions, there has been a net change of minus 15. See Table 2. There was 1 new institutional membership added which, with deletions, gives a net change of minus 5. See Table 3. The overall net change is minus 20.

Note that, as is the usual pattern, many of the deletions were members who joined at the Athabasca AGM but who did not renew.

This year resumes the overall downward trend in membership, despite the brief increase last year.

This report also contains a summary of members with their post-secondary affiliation. See Table 4.

The long term membership trend is shown in Table 5 and the associated graph.

The figures in this report are only approximately comparable to last year's figures. Due to the lateness of the Journal and the Magazine, memberships only paid to the end of 2004 have not yet been deleted. Many of these 27 will renew, but I would expect about 8 additional deletions.
