

Report of the CSTM Membership Secretary, 2007

Figures in this report are as of 2007 September 20. Members who have not paid up beyond the first quarter of 2006 have now been deleted. See Table 1.

Since the last report (October 2006) there have been 13 new individual memberships added. With deletions, there has been a net change of zero. See Table 2. There were 0 new institutional memberships added which, with deletions, gives a net change of minus 2. See Table 3. The overall net change is minus 2.

This report is about a month earlier than usual. About 50 memberships are due or overdue for renewal, and I would expect a significant proportion of these not to renew.

This year continues the downward trend in membership of last year, and indeed of the last 20 years.

This report also contains a summary of members with their post-secondary affiliation. See Table 4.
